If your property is served by a public or private sewer (non-septic) system, no such Health Department approval is required.	
Complete Set of Sealed Plans	This is a complete and concise illustration of the proposed work prepared with sufficient clarity to indicate the location, nature and extent of the work proposed and show in detail that it will conform to the provisions of the code, relevant laws, ordinances, rules and regulations. All required pages must be signed and sealed by a registered design professional where required by Chapter 471, Florida Statutes or Chapter 481, Florida Statutes. The maximum sheet size is 24"x 36". Manual N or Ashrae Calculation (Ac Calcs)	This is a sizing calculation used on commercial structures. If filled out properly, it will determine the correct size air conditioning equipment required to meet Florida's strict energy code. Martin County uses West Palm Beach Area Temperatures.	
FI Commercial Energy Form Flacom-2020	This the energy efficiency form required by Florida law. It indicates all items that affect the energy efficiency of the structure and shows numerically that the structure passes the minimum energy efficiency design requirements. This is signed and sealed by a Florida licensed Architect or Engineer. Jurisdiction: Martin County, FL (531000)	
Florida Accessibility Code Design Cert.	This is completed by the design professional and addresses the Florida Building Code requirement to spend up to 20% of the cost of a remodel or addition to improve the accessibility of a structure 8th Edition (2023) FBC/Access 202.4.	
Site Plans - Commercial	Approved, stamped and signed final site plans from Martin County Growth Management and Engineering Departments. Circle the building being constructed under this permit if multiple buildings are on the approved Site Plan.	
Commercial and Multi-Family Fire Protection/Life Safety Systems	for the appropriate Fire Protection/Life Safety System in accordance with the Florida Administrative Code Chapter 32 Responsibility Rules of Professional Engineering Concerning The Design of Fire Protection Systems.	

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
